

ACS Initial Training & Assessment

CCN₁

This course is designed to provide gas operatives with the CCN1 (Domestic Core Gas Safety) qualification, along with the initial assessments for relevant gas appliances. Successful completion is a requirement for operatives to become eligible for Gas Safe registration, which is a legal obligation for anyone working with domestic gas systems in the UK. All gas engineers who install, service, or repair gas appliances must hold the appropriate qualifications for their specific areas of work. These qualifications are awarded under the Accredited Certification Scheme (ACS), which is regulated by the United Kingdom Accreditation Service (UKAS) to ensure national safety and quality standards are met. Certification is valid for five years, after which operatives must undergo reassessment to maintain their registration and continue working legally within the industry.
